We are actively involved in promoting a social, democratic and competitive Europe in the European integration process.

- Support for talented young people with scholarship programs, in particular for students and doctoral candidates from low-income families or with a migrant background. This is our contribution to increasing educational democracy.
- The collective memory of social democracy to keep the historical roots of social democracy and the trade unions alive. Our archive, library, and contemporary history projects provide support for sociopolitical and historical research.
